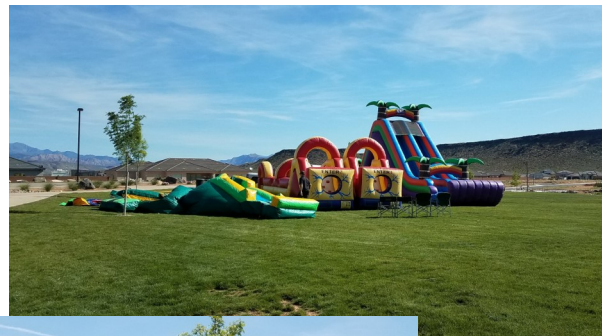

COPPER ROCK AND SKI LAKE SUBDIVISIONS NEAR DIXIE SPRINGS

Copper Rock is a 900 acre subdivision is next to the Cliff Dwellers and Sky Ranch Subdivision off of 700 S south of Hurricane. The subdivision was denied by Washington County so they want to be annexed into Hurricane. See this article:

COPPER ROCK DEVELOPMENT—CITY COUNCIL

The Hurricane Planning Commission discussed the Copper development at the 22 Mar 2017 meeting:

Consideration possible recommendation to the City Council on a zoning map change request from RA-1 Residential Agricultural 1 acre, to PDO/R-1-10, Planned Development Overlay/ Single Family Residential for 240 acres located south of 3000 South and east of Sand Hollow Road immediately west of the proposed Copper Rock annexation area - Toquerville Enterprises applicants; Brant Tuttle agent

This was the development mentioned in another newsletter. The zoning change was denied. The reason it was denied was given as follows:

This was the application:

Consideration and possible recommendation to the City Council on a zoning map change request from RA-1, Residential Agriculture, to PDO/RA-1, Planned Development Overlay, for approximately 84 acres located south of 1500 South at 920 West with 24 parcel numbers for the purpose of building a ski lake subdivision with 56 single family lots and 3 lakes – Brittany Christensen, applicant.

After much discussion, the application was denied for many reasons. There were a lot of issues with the soil and with the lakes they plan to build. They went in front of the Hurricane City Council on 20 April and it will be voted on by the council during the 4 May meeting. The notes from the 20 April meeting have not been posted so the results of that meeting are not known yet.

Mr. Ballard stated the roads that are there are already a problem and this would only add to it. He stated there are too many problems with the following: staff concerns about not having adequate fire protection, the road conditions, they won't offer a development agreement and some of the same individuals that have been involved in other failed projects are involved with this project. Paul Farthing stated the impact fees for each home wouldn't cover the cost for a new station let alone the cost of workers or equipment. Yovonda Hall stated she thinks it is a huge leap in density. She stated the City can't earmark money from the State until the State delegates it. She feels it is too premature. Mr. Ballard stated he was hearing tonight that they wanted to change everything but not stand behind it.

DIXIE SPRINGS COMMUNITY FUND

I have established a Dixie Springs Community Fund. The fund would be used for the following:

- Fight threats to our residential community by establishing a relationship with a lawyer who can provide council and other representation
- Fund the Dixie Springs Community Web Site
- Fund the email messages (free now but there is a cost once we get to a certain size).

No funds would be used without approval of a committee of community members.

The fund will **not** be used to enforce CC&RS.

The money for the fund would come from voluntary donations. We recommend \$100 per year per home,
