The Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") of Washington County, Utah (the "Issuer"), met in regular session on February 15, 2005, at Washington County Administration Building at 197 E. Tabernacle in St. George, Utah, at 4:00 p.m. with the following members of the Board present:

The meeting had been duly called to order and after other matters not pertinent to this resolution had been discussed, the County Clerk presented to the Board a Certificate of Compliance with Open Meeting Law with respect to this February 15, 2005, meeting, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Pursuant to published notice concerning the intent of the County to create the Washington County, Utah Special Improvement District No. 2004-1 (Dixie Springs) (the "District"), a public hearing was held on February 1, 2005 at which interested persons were heard concerning comments or protests relating to the District. The County Clerk then presented a statement stating that there were no protests against the creation of the District and the making of the proposed improvements therein.

Commissioner Gardner then introduced the following resolution in writing, which was fully discussed, and moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION NO 2005-920

A RESOLUTION TO CREATE THE WASHINGTON COUNTY, UTAH SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 2004-1 (DIXIE SPRINGS) OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, UTAH, DESCRIBED IN THE NOTICE OF INTENTION CONCERNING THE DISTRICT, AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY OFFICIALS TO PROCEED TO MAKE IMPROVEMENTS AS SET FORTH IN THE NOTICE OF INTENTION TO CREATE THE DISTRICT; AND RELATED MATTERS.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Washington County, Utah:

Section 1. The Board has heretofore considered each and every protest filed and has heard each and every person who wished to be heard in protest against the creation of Washington County, Utah Special Improvement District No. 2004-1 (Dixie Springs) (the "District") or making of any of the Improvements therein or on any other matter pertinent to the District. In view of the protests received at the meeting held for that purpose on February 1, 2005, action on the creation of said District was deferred by the Board until this meeting.

Section 2. The Board hereby determines that it will be in the best interest of the Issuer to construct certain Improvements within the District. The specific description of the nature of the Improvements is more particularly set out in the Notice of Intention, which has been published and mailed as required by law as set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto.

Section 3. The improvements proposed and described in the Notice of Intention to create the District are hereby authorized and the Washington County, Utah Special Improvement District No. 2004-1 (Dixie Springs), of the County, is hereby created.

Section 4. The properties to be included in the District described in the original Notice of Intention are approved by the Board. The legal description and tax identification number of said properties are more fully set forth on Exhibit C attached hereto.

Section 5. As required by law, the County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to file a copy of the Notice of Intention and resolution creating the District as finally approved, together with a list of properties proposed to be assessed described by tax identification number and legal description, in the Washington County Recorder's office within five days from the date hereof.

Section 6. In addition to the requirements of Section 3 hereof, immediately upon its adoption, this Resolution shall be placed in the records of the County where it will be continuously available for public inspection on a reasonable basis at the office of the County during regular business hours of the County, from and after the date hereof

through and including the last date of issuance of the bonds or such later time as is determined by the County.

Section 7. The County Surveyor is hereby authorized to prepare a notice to contractors for the receipt of bids for the construction of improvements. Said notice shall specify the time and place for the receipt of sealed bids and shall publish the notice one time in a newspaper having general circulation in the County at least fifteen (15) days before the date specified for the receipt of sealed bids. The Board shall in open session at the time specified in the notice, open, examine and publicly declare the bids and may reject any or all bids when deemed for the public good and, at such or a later meeting, shall reject all bids other than the lowest and best bid of a responsible bidder. If the price bid by the lowest and best responsible bidder exceeds the estimated costs as determined by the County Surveyor, the Board may nevertheless award a contract for the price so bid. The Board may in any case refuse to award a contract and may obtain new bids after giving a new notice to contractors or may determine to abandon the district or not to make some of the improvements proposed to be made.

Section 8. This resolution shall become effective upon passage and publication.

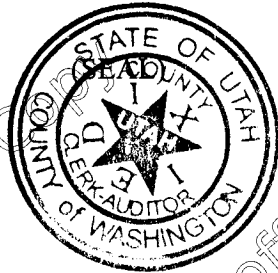

NOTICE OF INTENTION

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on December 21, 2004, the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") of Washington County, Utah (the "County"), adopted a resolution declaring its intention to create a special improvement district to be known as Washington County, Utah Special Improvement District No. 2004-1 (Dixie Springs) (the "District"). It is the intention of the Board to finance the cost of certain road, sewer, culinary water, electrical, recreational, and storm drainage improvements (collectively, the "Improvements") within the District and to levy a special assessment as provided in Title 17A, Chapter 3, Part 2, Utah Code Annotated 1953, as amended, on the property lying within the District for the benefit of which such assessment is to be expended in the making of such Improvements.

DESCRIPTION OF DISTRICT

The proposed District shall include the following properties:

Plats A, B and G of the Dixie Springs Subdivision, as amended and extended, as recorded in the Washington County Recorder's Office as of the date hereof.

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

The proposed Improvements to be constructed within the District and their anticipated location are as follows:

1. Access Road. The main access road to the subdivision will be 4300 West. To connect the Dixie Springs Subdivision to 4300 West, the construction of an extension of Dixie Springs Drive beginning at its termination in Plat G and extending westerly to 4300 West will be required. The improvements include construction of the road subgrade, 7" of untreated base course and 3" of bituminous pavement to a width of 32 feet.
2. Gravity Outfall Sewer Line. The Washington County Water Conservancy District (the "Conservancy District") is presently constructing the west side outfall line to full capacity. The property owners within the District will be assessed a portion of the costs of constructing said outfall line to assure capacity within said outfall line.
3. Storm Drainage Facilities. To handle storm drainage flows generated over the natural drainage flows, a detention basin will be constructed just west of Plat A. The basin will be approximately six (6) acres in size. The basin site is presently owned by the Conservancy District. The cost of storm drainage facilities includes the acquisition of the basin site. An 18" storm drain will extend north of the subdivision to convey flows to the natural drainage channel.
4. Culinary Water Facilities. Culinary water for the subdivision will be provided by the Conservancy District. The Conservancy District's existing facilities include five culinary water wells, a one million gallon storage reservoir located to the south of Plat E, and an 18" transmission line.

Other culinary water improvements include 8" through 12" culinary pipeline with associated valves, etc. required to operate the water system. A 3/4" water service connection will be extended to each lot. A meter box, yoke and corporation stop will be constructed at the property line. The Conservancy District will provide the water

meter at the time of connection. Approximately 69 fire hydrants will be placed throughout the subdivision providing fire protection to each lot.

5. Sanitary Sewer Improvements. A wastewater collection system comprised of 8" sewer line with an average depth of approximately nine (9) feet together with manholes four or five feet in diameter will be constructed. A 4" sewer lateral will be extended to each lot. The sewer system will connect to the treatment facilities of the Ash Creek Special Service District by a gravity outfall system previously described.

6. Street Improvements. Improvements beginning with 7" high back curb and gutter will be constructed along each street and in front of every lot. Sidewalk 4' wide will be constructed along residential streets and sidewalk 5' wide will be constructed along collector and arterial streets. Drainage boxes, pipe and concrete waterways will be constructed as necessary. Street improvements will include subgrade preparation, 7" of untreated base course and 3" of bituminous pavement on collector streets above 60 feet in width and 6" of untreated base course and 2-1/2" of bituminous pavement for residential streets. Signage and monumentation shall also be provided in accordance with present County standards.

7. Electrical Improvements. An underground electrical system will be placed approximately two feet behind the sidewalk. All electrical wiring will be encased in conduit. Transformers, fuse pads, switches, etc., will be placed so as to provide for a functioning electrical system.

8. Open Space/Park/Recreational Improvements. Open space/park/recreational improvements including landscaping, public parking facilities, and recreational sports fields and related improvements will be financed in and around the District.

METHOD OF ASSESSMENT

Assessments will be levied on a "per lot" method of assessment. For assessment purposes, a lot is defined herein as a platted lot within the Dixie Springs Subdivision, Washington County, Utah, according to the official records of the Washington County Recorder¹.

ESTIMATED COST OF IMPROVEMENTS

The total cost of Improvements in the District, including overhead costs and costs of funding a reserve fund, is estimated to be \$11,641,077, which is anticipated to be paid by a special assessment to be levied against the property which may be directly or indirectly benefited by such improvements, which benefits need not actually increase the fair market value of the property to be assessed. Approximately \$962,077 has already been paid by property owners as a prepayment of assessment which will be used to finance electrical improvements within the District or to fund a special stabilization reserve fund. Estimated costs of assessment include estimated overhead costs which the County projects to incur in the creation and administration of the District. The property owners' portion of the total estimated costs of the Improvements may be financed during the construction period by the use of interim warrants. The interest on said warrants, if issued, will be assessed to the property owners. In lieu of utilizing a guaranty fund, the County intends to create a special reserve fund to secure payment of the special assessment bonds (the "Bonds") to be issued by the County to finance the proposed Improvements. The reserve fund will be initially funded with proceeds of the Bonds in an amount equal to approximately Ten percent (10%) of the principal amount of Bonds issued. The County anticipates applying any moneys remaining in the reserve fund to the final payment on the Bonds which, in turn, would offset the final assessment payments to be made by the owners of property benefited by such Improvements, all of which will be further described in the assessment ordinance to be adopted by the County. In addition, estimated costs of assessment include estimated overhead costs which the

¹ Two lots within the District, Lot 219 in Plat A and Lot 226 in Plat B, are larger than the typical lot. For purposes of calculating the assessment, Lot 219 in Plat A shall be treated as having 7 lots and Lot 226 in Plat B shall be treated as having 6 lots.

County projects to incur in the creation and administration of the District. The estimated cost of Improvements to be assessed against the lots within the District is as follows:

<u>Improvements</u>	<u>Estimated Cost per Lot</u>
All improvements as hereinabove described	\$21,478

The Project Engineer has prepared a "Certificate of Project Engineer" which, among other things, identifies the costs of the proposed Improvements. Said Certificate of Project Engineer is on file in the County Clerk's office who will make such information available to all interested parties.

ASSESSMENTS AND LEVY OF TAXES

It is the intention of the Board to levy assessments as provided by the laws of Utah on all parcels and lots of real property within the District benefiting by the proposed Improvements described herein. The purpose of the assessment and levy is to pay those costs of the proposed Improvements which the County will not assume and pay. The method of assessment shall be by lot as set forth hereinabove.

The assessments may be paid by property owners in ten (10) annual principal installments with interest on the unpaid balance at a rate or rates fixed by the Board, or the whole or any part of the assessment may be paid without interest within fifteen (15) days after the ordinance levying the assessment becomes effective. The assessments shall be levied according to the benefits to be derived by each property within the District. Other payment provisions and enforcement remedies shall be in accordance with Title 17A, Chapter 3, Part 2, Utah Code Annotated 1953, as amended.

A map of the proposed District and specifications of the proposed Improvements and other related information are on file in the office of the County Clerk who will make such information available to all interested persons.

TIME FOR FILING PROTESTS

Any person who is the owner of record of property to be assessed in the District described in this Notice of Intention shall have the right to file in writing a protest against the creation of the District or to make any other objections relating thereto. Protests shall describe or otherwise identify the property owned of record by the person or persons making the protest. Protests shall be filed with the County Clerk of Washington County, Utah, on or before 5:00 p.m. on January 31, 2005. Thereafter at 4:00 p.m. on February 1, 2005, the Board will meet in public meeting at the County offices at the Washington County Administration Building at 197 E. Tabernacle in St. George, Utah, to consider all protests so filed and hear all objections relating to the proposed District. After such consideration and determination, the Board shall adopt a resolution either abandoning the District or creating the District either as described in this Notice of Intention or with deletions and changes made as authorized by law; but the Board shall abandon the District and not create it if the necessary number of protests as provided herein have been filed on or before the time specified in this Notice of Intention for the filing of protests after eliminating from such filed protests: (i) protests relating to property or relating to a type of improvement which has been deleted from the District, and (ii) protests which have been withdrawn in writing prior to the conclusion of the hearing. The necessary number of protests shall mean the following: Protests representing one-half of the lots to be assessed where an assessment is proposed to be made according to number of lots.
